SETTING FORTH FROM MONTREAL, THE 130-GUEST YORKTOWN FIRST VISITS THE IDYLIC city of Quebec. Sail up the St. Lawrence River and continue to the Gaspé Peninsula. Savor the historic and natural attractions of Prince Edward Island, including Charlottetown's old seaport; Prince House, birthplace of the Canadian Confederation; and Prince Edward Island National Park. Explore the well-preserved towns and pristine countryside of Nova Scotia, including historic Halifax and Lunenburg. This remarkable passage culminates with calls along Maine's inviting shores whose highlights include Bar Harbor, the natural splendor of Acadia National Park, and inviting Boothbay Harbor before we end in Gloucester, Massachusetts.

Day 1
MONTREAL, QUEBEC, CANADA |
EMBARK

Fly to Montreal and embark *Yorktown*. (D)

Day 2
QUEBEC CITY

Quebec City, with its old city walls, narrow cobblestoned lanes, country squares, copper gables, outdoor cafés and historic battlements, remains one of North America's most romantic spots. The authentic, undeveloped charm led UNESCO to designate it a World Heritage site in 1985. Discover the Upper and Lower Towns, the Citadel, the Plains of Abraham, and the Place Royale. (B, L, D)

Day 3
CRUISING THE SAGUENAY RIVER |
AT SEA

Relax aboard *Yorktown* and attend a lecture by one of our onboard experts as we sail the Saguenay and St. Lawrence Rivers. Wander out on deck to enjoy the rugged beauty of the Saguenay fjord. The meeting of the St. Lawrence and Saguenay Rivers supports an abundance

of krill, making the area attractive to whales and excellent for whale watching opportunities. (B, L, D)

Day 4
GASPÉ | PERCE |
ILE BONAVENTURE | GASPÉ

From "Land's End," visit the National Park of Bonaventure Island and Perce Rock, rising out of the sea to a height of almost 300 feet. Its neighbor, Bonaventure Island, houses a migratory bird sanctuary with the largest concentration of Northern Gannets in North America. (B, L, D)

Day 5
CARAQUET, NEW BRUNSWICK

Arrive at the colorful port of Caraquet, situated on the northeastern point of the Acadian Peninsula. Spend time exploring the expansive Village Historique; a living museum of Acadian culture and heritage with authentic homes, workshops and costumes dating between 1770 and 1949. (B, L, D)

Day 6
SUMMERSIDE, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Enjoy a panoramic tour of the Prince Edward Island, including the Prince

Edward Island National Park supporting over 200 bird species and spend time in the charming fishing village of Rustico. (B, L, D)

Day 7
PORT HAWKESBURY, NOVA SCOTIA

Transfer to the charming town of Baddeck, once the home of the great inventor, Alexander Graham Bell. Explore the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site and view the immense collection that illustrates the life of this great inventor.

Day 8
HALIFAX

Arrive in Halifax, a vital port city with an array of cultural and historic delights. In the morning, take a driving tour of historic Halifax then visit Fairview Cemetery, the final resting place of 100 victims of the Titanic disaster. Spend time at the Public Gardens then explore the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site. (B, L, D)


Day 9
LUNENBURG

The 19th-century village of Lunenburg is



known for seafaring and natural beauty. Take a walking tour of the Old Town and also visit the aquarium at the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic. (B, L, D)

Day 10
YARMOUTH

Call in Nova Scotia's Yarmouth, a fishing port with a long history of shipbuilding and lobster catching. This charming town, with its Cape Forchu Lighthouse and charming Victorian houses, is also home to several cultural centers. Visit the Yarmouth County Museum & Archives. (B, L, D)

Day 11
BAR HARBOR | ACADIA NATIONAL PARK | BAR HARBOR, MAINE, USA

Explore Bar Harbor, set on Maine's dramatic coast. Surrounded by Acadia National Park, this quaint fishing village was a fashionable resort town in the late 1800s and the summer home of influential families, including the Astors and Rockefellers. In the afternoon, tour Acadia National Park to discover the Wild Gardens of Acadia, showcasing over 300

native plant species. Also visit the Abbe Museum's collections chronicling Maine's 10,000 years of Native American culture and history. (B, L, D)

Day 12
BATH | BOOTHBAY HARBOR

Call at the Maine Maritime Museum, in the town of Bath. See the displays on shipbuilding and lobstering. Continue to Boothbay Harbor, often referred to as "the boating capital of New England." From the ship's deck, enjoy a panoramic view of the lighthouses that dot the coast. Walk along the town's quaint streets, lined with charming shops and restaurants. (B, L, D)

Day 13
GLOUCESTER | BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS | DISEMBARK

Disembark *Yorktown*. Transfer to the Boston Logan airport for return flights home. (B)


Yorktown — A Ship Built for Coastal Cruising

The *Yorktown* is the perfect vessel for relaxed and convivial exploration of North America's great coastal waterways. Built in Florida in 1988 specifically for coastal cruising and certified by the U.S. Coast Guard, the *Yorktown* flies the American flag and is staffed by friendly and experienced American officers and crew. 257 feet long, 43 feet wide, with a draft of 8 feet, the *Yorktown* is able to maneuver in secluded waterways and visit small ports that are inaccessible to larger vessels. And *Yorktown's* American registry makes it possible to operate domestic itineraries unavailable to foreign-flag ships. In addition to a large sun deck, the *Yorktown* boasts a spacious lounge for social gatherings and lectures as well as quiet space for private conversation. The ship's cuisine, served in a dining room large enough to accommodate all guests at once, emphasizes American regional culinary traditions and specialties. Both the lounge and dining room are surrounded by large picture windows that afford unobstructed views of the passing scenery. Accommodating 138 guests in 69 exterior cabins, the *Yorktown* enjoys an atmosphere of warm and relaxed informality that endears it to repeat and new guests alike.
